ty, and the Secretary shall give him notice in writing of the amount, signifying, at the same time that if it is not paid by the 15th of April, he will be expelled.

Lending of money.

ART. 15. There shall always remain one hundred and seventy-sive Pounds, at least, in the hands of the Treasurer, for the contingent demands of the Society; and no smaller sum than sifty Pounds shall be lent, on interest, and no greater sum than two hundred Pounds shall be lent to one individual. When there is money to be lent the applicants who are members shall have the preference. The security shall be a promissory note in the private name of the Treasurer, payable one year after date, to his order, and indorsed at least, by two securities, approved of by the Society.

Relief.

ART. 16. The applications for relief, as well on account of sickness as for funeral expences and relief to widows and children, shall be made to the Secretary, who shall submit them immediately to the President, and if he judge the case to be com-
