ROBINS APPEALS AGAINST VERDICT

Attempt Begins to Set Aside Damages to Laura Lowry.

Lowry.

Breach of promise action before the first appellate court.

Mr. Robins, an appeal by F. B. Robins against a verdict of \$10,000 in favor of Laura Lowry, in her breach of promise action tried before Chief Justice R. M. Meredith and a jury in June last. The grounds for the appeal set up by F. B. Robins, K.C., are lack of corroboration of evidence; the learned trial judge's charge to the jury not warranted, and no reasonable finding of the jury could be based on the evidence.

A motion was made on behalf of Louis Renaud, before Mr. Justice Middleton, for an order quashing a certain order made Oct. 19, 1918, by Silvanus Veegar, police magistrate for North Bay, whereby it was ordered that one carload, apparently containing 123 barrels of bottled liquor, seized by L. P. Didier of North Bay, be forfeited to His Majesty, to be destroyed or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the minister may direct, upon the following among other grounds: That there was no evidence adduced before the magistrate to show that the liquor was intended to be sold or kept for sale, or otherwise in contravention of the Ontario Temperance Act. There was no evidence adduced before the magistrate showing any reason for the forfeiture of the liquor.

The carload of liquor was consigned to W. L. Mackenzie & Co., Ltd., Winnipeg. The car was shipped from Montreal to Winnipeg via North Bay, and was labeled "Pickles." W. L. Mackenzie & Co., Ltd., had no knowledge of any consignment of liquor, and had no interest in the liquor. The car was stranded at North Bay, owing to a defective draw-head, and while undergoing repairs was seized. It having been found the barrels containing whiskey instead of "pickles," the car was shipped back to Toronto on the order of the license commission for Ontario. The motion was adjourned till Tuesday next at the request of counsel for the defendant. James Haveron, K.C., appeared for the defendant. J. R. Cartwright, K.C., for the crown.

Company Wound Up.

Mr. Justice Middleton granted an order winding up the Parah Mining Co. of New Liskeard, with reference to the master-in-ordinary, The Trust Liquidator. The company was incorporated by letters patent under the Ontario Companies Act in 1908 with a nominal capital stock of \$2,000,000 divided into 2,000,000 shares of \$1 each.

G. H. Sedgewick appeared for the petitioners, the Northern Ontario Light & Power Co., Limited, and Grainger v. Order Canadian Home Circles. Mr. Justice Middleton: This is a motion to set aside an execution. The result is that the execution must be set aside and an order now be made for payment of the amounts with interest. As excess is divided it will probably be fair to give no costs.

First divisional court gave judgment in the case of M. H. Smith and Tighe allowing the appeal so far as to fix the damages. If the parties cannot agree. Costs of reference and of this appeal to be in the discretion of the court.
