NINE MONTHS IN PRISON FOR CONDUCTED ENGINEER

Law's Penalty for Violating Rules Which Led to Fatal Wreck.

GUELPH, Sept. 19.—Engineer Mark B. Reid, who was in the collision at Gourcock, where three men were killed, was found guilty on the charge of breaking the rules of the G. T. R. and was sentenced to nine months in prison.

Justice Anglin expressed regret at having to deliver judgment, but it was a duty imposed upon him, and he could not escape it.

He originally intended to sentence him to one year, but, taking into consideration that the accused had already suffered mentally and physically, and had lost his position, he had decided to reduce the sentence by three months, and he would see if he could not be confined to the county jail instead of being sent to the Central and herded with criminals, amongst whom the prisoner certainly did not belong.

In summing up the case, Mr. Guthrie, who appeared for the defence, said there had clearly been no criminal intent. The defendant had not been with the road for a year. His engine was not satisfactory, and he was acting under the control of a conductor who was asleep.

Mr. Guthrie contended that the orders must have been wrong. The defendant had been doing his best, and had been forced to stay too long on duty.

"In making my decision," said his lordship, "the Thompson case and the decision rendered there has been disregarded."

In order to keep him clear of criminal association the term was not made in Central Prison.

Reid was visibly affected. He was the conductor, sentenced to three years, was released from the penitentiary after serving nine weeks, and it is expected Reid will also be paroled before long.

Reid, who lives in Hamilton, has served six years on the Grand Trunk, three years as an engineer on the middle division.
