Ottawa, March 24.—(Special)—The Co-lonial Office has transmitted to the Government a despatch from the Gov-ernor of Barbadoes, W.I., in which he calls attention to the unsatisfactory and unsuitable packages in which Can-adian products are shipped to that isladian products are shipped to that isl-and, and makes certain suggestions for improvement of trade. He says that four reaches the island packed in soft wood barrels, which appear to affect the keeping quality of the flour. He suggests that hardwood barrels be sub-stituted, and says that barrels from the United States are made of red oak. Butter and lard come in tubs of 25 pounds and upwards. The people pre-fer them in tins of 5, 10 or 25 pounds. Beet comes in barrels, while half bar-rels are preferred. Canadian cheese is all right as to the packages, but it is 'too good' and therefore too expen-sive for the masses.

The Puddled Bars Bounty.

The Puddled Bars Bounty. New regulations have been adopted by the Government governing the pay-ment of the bounty on iron puddled bars made from Canadian pig iron out of Canadian ore. Manufacturers are obliged to make affidavit that they have complied with all the require-ments of the law before the bounty can be obtained and the manufacture of iron puddled bars on which it is intended to claim the bounty must hereafter be made under customs su-pervision, such supervision to be paid for by the manufacturer.
