"It does not seem to be generally known," replied the judge, with a smile, "that when the franchises were granted originally a clause was inserted specifying the procedure in case the government should wish to purchase. If the government right were simply that of eminent domain, the companies might overcharge; but the wording of the section is: "The United States may, for postal, military or other purposes, purchase all the telegraph lines, property and effects of any or all companies acting under the provisions of the act entitled "An act to aid in the construction of telegraph lines and to secure to the government the use of the same for postal, military or other purposes," at an appraised value to be ascertained by five competent, disinterested persons,' chosen as I have said." The judge had read the act from a document be took from his pocket.
