HOW TO STAKE A CLAIM IN ONTARIO'S SILVER LAND

Well Known Prospector Who Has Made His Pile Gives Some Advice to Beginners

There is probably not one man in ten thousand outside the mining regions of Canada who knows how to stake a mining claim. How many explorers of the world to-day, who decide to start upon a prospecting tour into the great silver belt, the northern part of this province, would know just how to go about staking a claim should they stumble over a rich discovery of mineral?

It would be a great pity if men who happened to face the hardships incidental to exploration in the north and make a find, were to realize the ynever knew how to stake their discovery, and then to find, perhaps, if they had some idea how to strike their claim that they were not in possession of qualifications which the government supply in return for certain consideration.

Mr. F. A. MacIntosh, one of the discoverers of the Bartlett Mines at Gow Ganda, was in the city yesterday, and this well-known Woodstock old boy, son of Mr. A. J. MacIntosh of that city, undertook to explain to The World reporter how the prospector should go about his work in the north country.

On the north claims some four miles distant, and I did not think it worth while leaving the property to find him.
