

# NIPISSING HAS 131 VEINS FINDS IN KEEWATIN

This Formation and the Gillies Limits Has Been Proven to Contain Deposits of Rich Ore.

COBALT, Sept. 6.—The Nipissing mine now have on their property 131 valuable veins, all of which goes to create the correct and proper impression that right here in Cobalt camp is one of the biggest mining propositions in the world to-day.

Not many days ago, while prospecting work was being carried on in the vicinity of vein No. 129, another vein was discovered, but it was not ascertained. It is much the same formation as veins 129 and 131, inasmuch as it shows the same argentic deposition and argentine in the vein matter. In trenching the vein it has been discovered that for a distance of 13 or 14 feet it is composed of a siliceous and silvery silver. The management view this new find as highly significant of other valuable deposits in that part of the property, taking in veins No. 129 to 131 and the others recognized.

The similarity of the veins found in the aforementioned portion of the property is very noticeable. Vein No. 129 is comparatively narrow on the surface, having an average width of from one to two inches, as in the case of No. 131, and runs from 4000 to 5000 ounces to the ton.

This vein has been uncovered for a total distance of 70 feet and runs parallel to the surface for a considerable extent of six inches in spots, and averaging richer ore.

Both veins have argentic, and the surface veins are similarly decomposed on the surface.

**Still Stripping.**  
Gangs of men are at work stripping veins 129, 130 and 131, and no sinking will be done for some little time, when it is expected underground operations will have valuable results.

However, the stripping is not without direct benefit, as some 40 bags of ore have been taken from the muck, ore that will assay from 5000 to 6000 ounces.

Active prospecting will now be the

object of the management, and it is satisfactory to note that the fresh discovery of the gold in the new shaft excites in no small way the wonder of engineers, who a few years ago endeavored to put the "double cross" on this formation.

That the keewatin is now being looked for is a fact that cannot be passed over unnoticed, and perhaps no better illustration of the fact can be given than some time than the Waldman discovery in the Gilles' limit, just below the Savage properties.

It is a fact that there has been the direct cause of feverish prospecting in that district, and the rewards have been amply satisfactory.

It is a fact that there has been accomplished and nearly 20,000 feet of trenching done, and the keewatin has stood the test.

It is a fact that the gold is improving at depth, and besides this, the work of sinking the shaft has disclosed some small but important strikers that evidently lead to some big bonanza.

The Youngs and O'Brien claims lying west of the Waldman are also sinking, and as the Goulds consolidated, the latter company has examined the finds in the limits, and are unusually optimistic about the values.
