Pointing out the advantages which students could obtain from active association with the Literary Society, Senator Ross said the art of good oral expression was one of the chief. Thru 37 years of public life he had known many men who were high-ly gifted as public speakers, and among them he could recall none more forceful than Sir John A. Macdonald.


