It was necessary to cut away part o fa steep nill at the place selected for the wire. The remainder of the hill sloped at a proper angle to support the concrete grandstand.

At the first turn an arm of the lake was filled in and just around the first turn it was necessary to take a large slice out of another hill to build the track. 
