

Unemployment Insurance Entitlements

Mr. Speaker: I understand there is disposition to eliminate entirely that stage of the bill. If it were to be done at once, the more expeditious method would be to send it to committee of the whole and deal with the committee stage here and now.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Agreed.

Minister of Manpower and Immigration (Mr. Cullen), seconded by Mr. MacEachen, that Bill C-52, an act to provide for the consideration of certain unemployment insurance entitlements, be now read the second time and be referred to committee of the whole?
