Indian Head Reserve

13<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1883

Sir,

I have the honor to report that on the 10<sup>th</sup> inst in company with Horrie, Piz. a Pot and five other Indians I went round the Reserve starting from a post three miles East of the N.E. post of the Reserve we struck the post thence South 12 miles to the S.E. post, thence west along the Northern boundary of Township 11. Range 14. Three miles, thence North to the place of beginning.

The North half of the Reserve is wooded with a few small lakes on the Western half along the east boundary the wood is very small and thick, the country having been over run by fire a few years ago. The Southern half is beautiful rolling prairie, dotted with numerous lakes and of fine alluvial soil, well adapted to agricultural purposes along the Eastern boundary we saw good wood quite large enough for building purposes.
