THE WAR NEWS

Three British vessels, including one trawler, and a Russian, a French and an American steamer were sunk by German submarines on Friday and Saturday. An old British destroyer, the Recruit, was also sunk, but two German destroyers shared the same fate.

The Canadian casualties in recent fighting are now said to have been far greater than two thousand. One London report says they may even reach six thousand. As yet very few maritime province names appear, and it is evident that the brunt of the fighting fell on men from the western provinces.

There have been no great developments along either the eastern or western battle fronts for some days past. The lines of the Allies which were bent back by the Germans north of Ypres are being straightened again, and the force of the German offensive at that point appears to have been spent.

The Standard this morning devotes a large space to the announcement of the war and parish meetings of the Conservative party in this city and county. The signs point to an early appeal by the Borden government to the country. The Standard's Ottawa correspondent sends along the statement made by Sir Robert Borden on Saturday that the question had not yet been "definitely" considered but was being "weighed."

The impression is growing that there will be a general election in June, and it is stated in well informed circles that June 28 will be the date, with nominations on June 21, one week earlier.

The Standard, in a long article preparing its readers for the plunge, observes: "It is believed, furthermore, that the Liberal press overestimates and exaggerates the amount of disturbance an election would cause. It might affect some Liberal newspapers and politicians, but no sane man will seriously regard the contention that the settlement of Canada's domestic differences would interfere with the business of war in which the country is engaged."

from a patriotic and a business standpoint. "That the political strife, inseparable from the holding of a general election, might at this time occasion such division of opinion as would seriously interfere with the provision of assistance that all Canadians are so anxious to give towards securing victory for the Empire and the allies."

The people of Canada do not want the bitterness of a political campaign while every morning the cables are bringing news of casualties to Canadian soldiers in the field. The real reason for an appeal to the people is the fear of further disclosures such as those recently made before the public accounts committee. Hon. Robert Rogers also believes the chances of getting abundant campaign funds are better now than later.

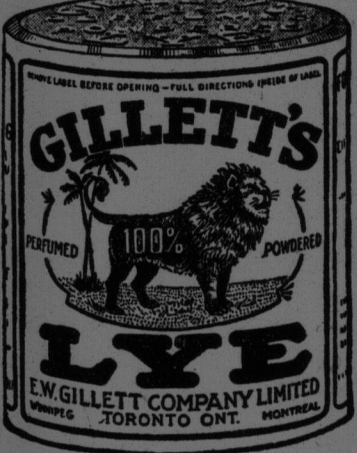
KEEP TO THE FACTS With its usual disregard for the facts the Standard this morning says: "The government voted large sums of money for the prosecution of Canada's share in the Empire struggle. The Liberals supported the vote and blatantly advertised their patriotism in doing it."

The suggestion that cheap lodging houses should be licensed and a register kept by them is one that should be carried out. Belgian refugees arriving in Toronto tell horrible tales of German atrocities, in which priests, men, women and children were done to death without pity and without the slightest justification for any ill-treatment. A peace that is not preceded by fitting punishment of these butchers would shame civilization.

A White Paper brought down in the British parliament proves conclusively that the drink evil has been interfering seriously with the industrial and transport service. It is alleged that the greatly increased pay of the men has led to drunkenness and loss of time. Admiral Jellicoe warns the admiralty that the fleet is suffering because of failure of the Clyde and Tyne workmen to provide promptly the needed repairs. Publication of the facts will bring the remedy, however drastic it may be.

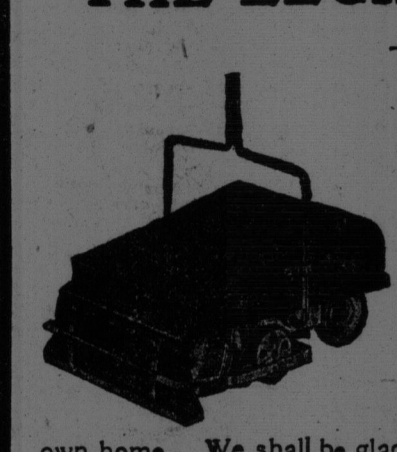

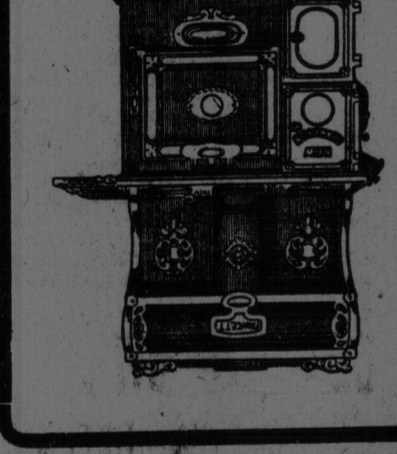

NEW CANADIAN DENTAL CORPS

Organization as Separate Branch—Will Treat Teeth of Men in Training Camps and at the Front

(Toronto Mail and Empire). Canada is taking the lead in the development of a new branch of the military service which, though the need of it never yet been formed in the British Army. This new unit is an army dental corps, arrangements for the establishment of which are now being made in Ottawa.

The idea of a dental corps distinct from the army medical service originated in Toronto in the Toronto Dental Rifle Association, and its necessity was shown last winter, when city dentists were engaged for some two months putting in order the teeth of the members of the second contingent. This work was practically a voluntary service on the part of many of the city dentists, who gave up in some cases several entire days to it. The two dentists on the staff of the A. M. C. could not possibly have covered the amount of work even

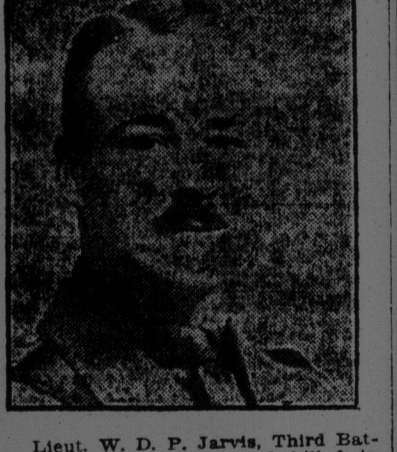
