WAS IN JAP 'QUAKE.

To have been right in the heart of the Japanese "quake" and come out alive was the experience of H. L. Herzog, Swiss watch merchant who arrived in the city yesterday and will sail today for Switzerland on the C. P. R. liner Minnedosa. He expects to return next spring, via the Mediterranean. Two distinct shocks were felt, Mr. Herzog said. He praised the relief work being carried on by the Japanese Red Cross.

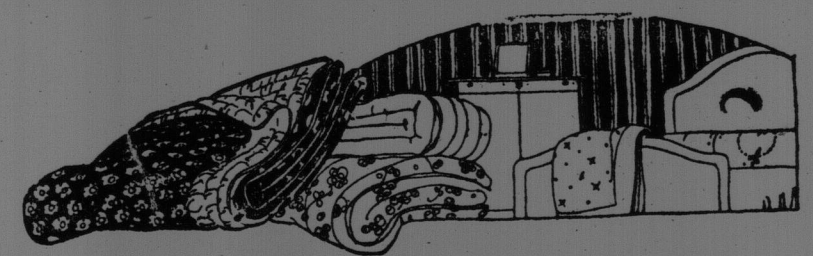
