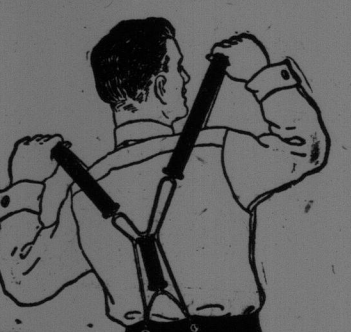

QUEBEC FOREST FIRE SITUATION VERY ALARMING
Quebec, June 8.—(Canadian Press).—Stating that in the Temiscaming region of Quebec Province 100,000 acres of valuable standing timber and pulp wood had fallen a prey to forest fires, Chief Forester Pich, who returned yesterday from a trip to organize fire prevention there, affirmed that the situation was very alarming.
He added that in the St. Maurice, Lake St. John, Saguenay, Temiscouata, Bonaventure and Gaspé districts where no rain has fallen lately, fresh fires were being reported every day. These fires had been caused in some cases by settlers burning slash and in others by fishermen, it said.
A letter expressing appreciation of the message of sympathy sent to Sussex after the recent fire was received by the Board of Trade yesterday from Mayor McKenna, of Sussex. Mayor McKenna thanked the board for their inquiries as to the necessity for assistance for the sufferers and said that if any was necessary he would advise them. He said that he hoped a fire district would be established and that only brick, stone or concrete buildings would be permitted in the town. He expressed the belief that the destroyed section would be restored with better buildings than were burned.
