

Water-proofed leather boots and shoes are very satisfactory for protecting the feet during rain or snow storms. Though they have a tendency to cause the feet to perspire, they are not as objectionable in this respect as rubber, the U. S. Department of Agriculture states.

In summer the department advises a grease harder than that used in the winter. As there is less need for water resistant shoes in summer than in spring and winter, and because of the tendency of the heavily greased shoes to cause the feet to perspire and swell in hot weather, the quantity of grease used in summer should not exceed the amount the leather will take up without leaving the surface greasy. In winter, especially if it is desired to secure the maximum waters.
