M'WHIRTER IS NEW CHAMPION

Wins Plattsburg Meet With 110 Points—Jewtraw Second, Donovan Third.

By winning first in the half mile event at Plattsburg yesterday, Roy McWhirter clinched the National championship of the United States with a total of 110 points. Charles Jewtraw finished third in the half mile and with a total of eighty points, finished second in the big meet. The three mile event went to Donovan, who aggregated fifty points and finished third in the series. The local entries failed to win any points yesterday. Gorman won the fifth heat of the half mile, but lost out in the semi-final. In the three mile he fought hard, but failed to place. Garnett failed to qualify in his trial heat of the half mile. Leonard and Tebo both qualified in the 220 yards for boys twelve years and under, the former winning his heat and the latter finishing third. In the final the time was sensational for such small boys and Tebo finished a close fourth. Logan qualified in the half mile, but was just nosed out of third place in the final. The summary follows.

Junior 12-year-olds 220 yards dash, won by Harold Fortune, Lake Placid; Orle Green, Saranac Lake, second; John Darrah, Lake Placid, third. Time, 22 seconds.


Junior 12-year-olds 220 yard dash, won by Jack Shea, Saranac Lake; Ned Muffin, Saranac Lake, second; Wesley Champagne, Plattsburgh, third. Time, 26 2-5 seconds.

Junior 14-year-olds 440 yards dash, won by Carlton Parody, Lake Placid; Ernest Graves, Saranac Lake, second; Earl Finch, Lake Placid, third. Time, 42 2-5 seconds.
