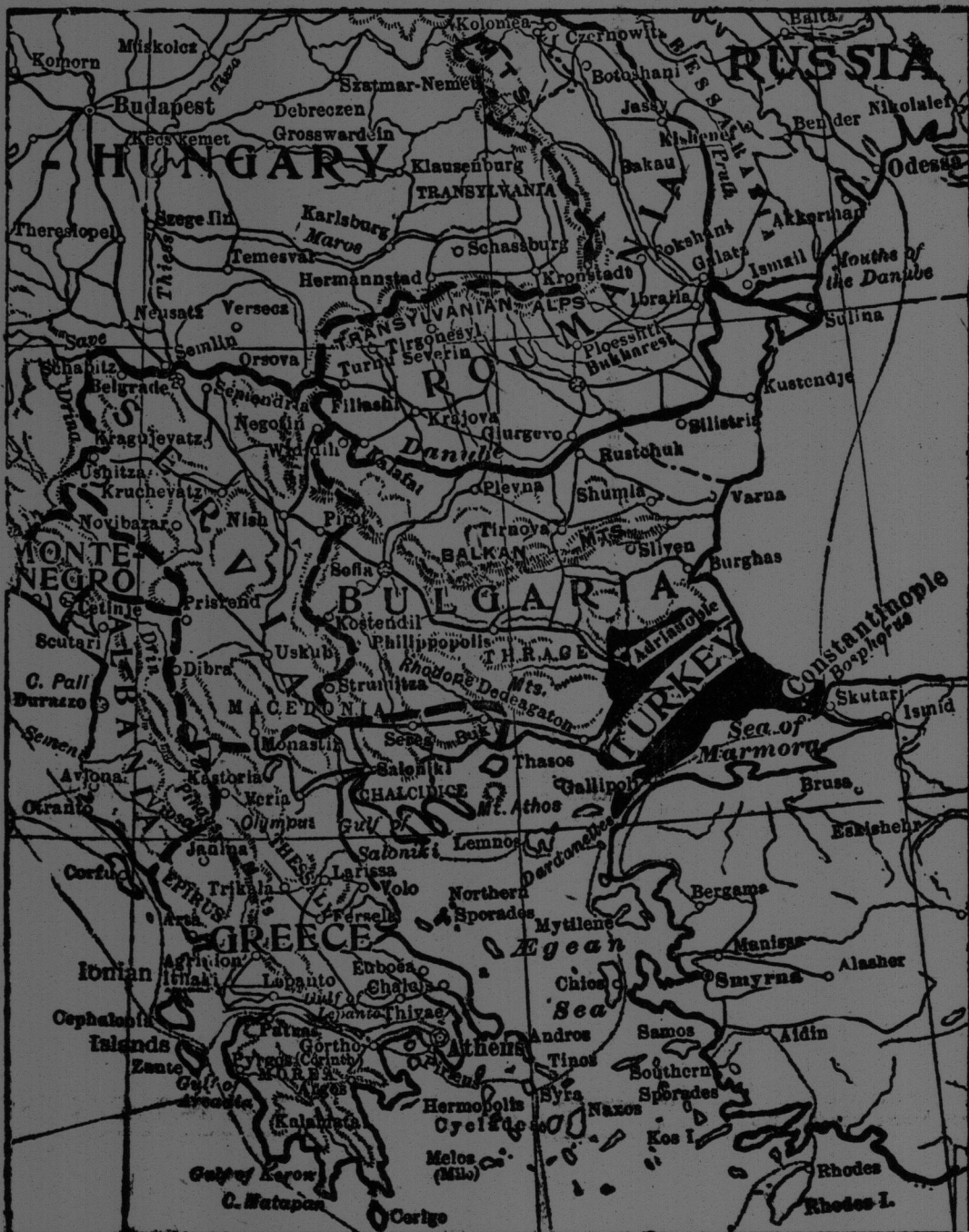


HOW THE BALKANS BLOCK TURKEY

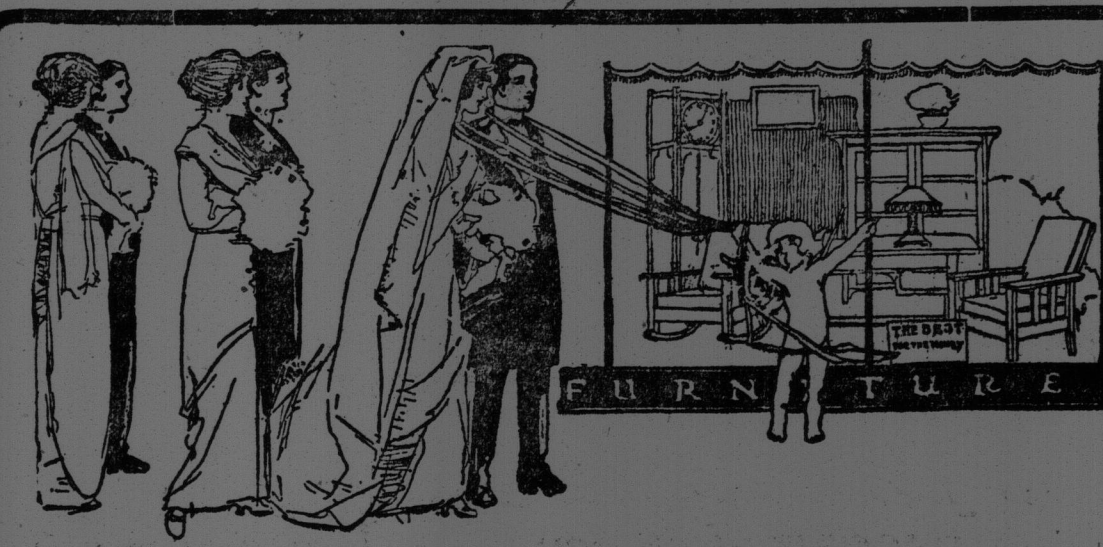

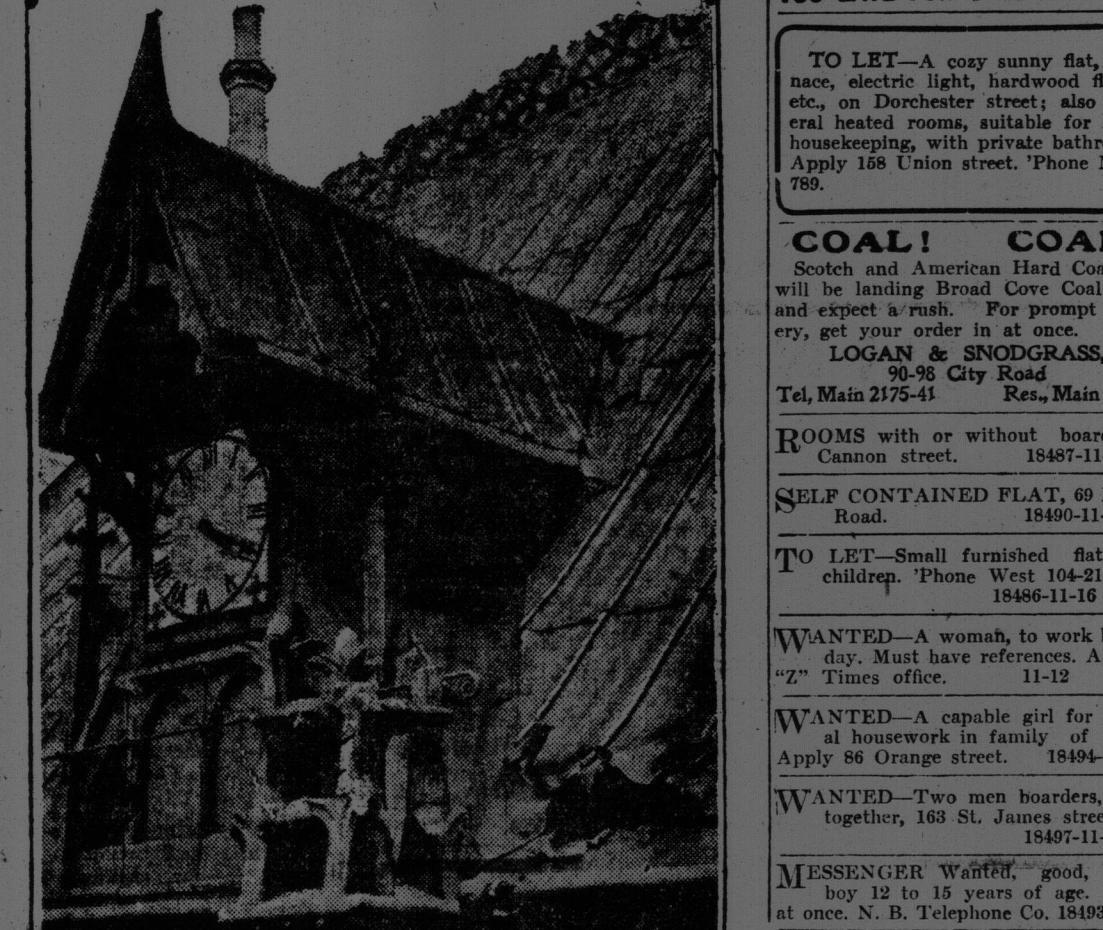
