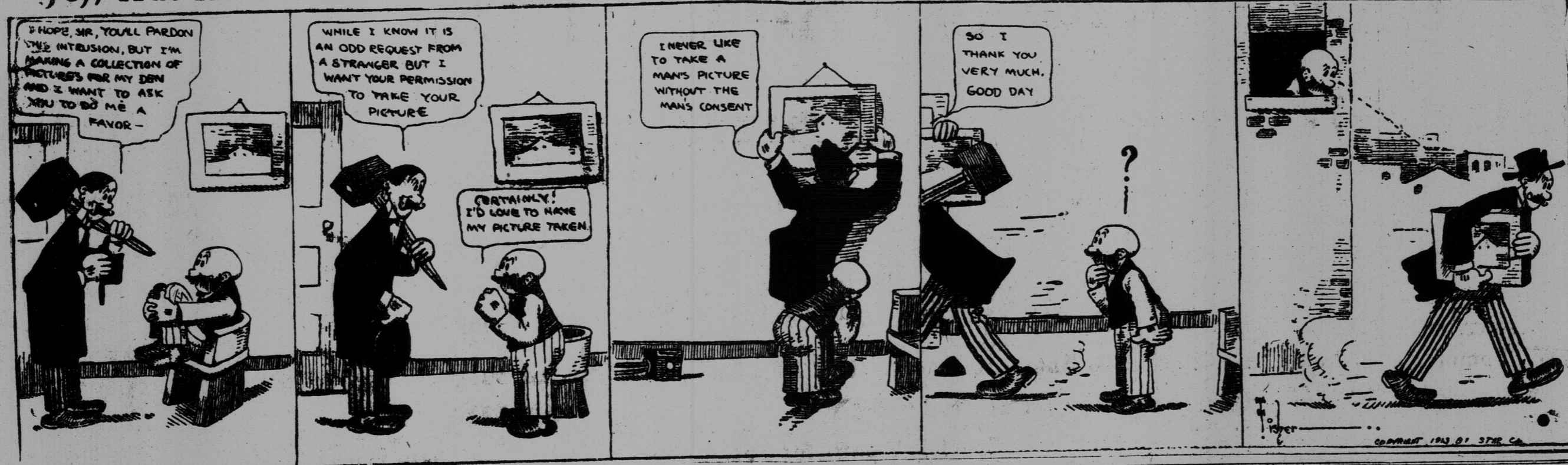


Jeff Has His Picture Taken Without Posing By "Bud" Fisher



ST. JOHN LOSES TO BANGOR SIX TO THREE

Reduction Opposed

Moncton, N. B., July 17.—At the evening session of the High Court of L. O. Foresters for New Brunswick the question of making effective the recent legislation amending the charter of the L. O. Foresters so as to permit of the same being adopted by a two-thirds vote of the supreme court was considered. The effect of the change is to reduce the indemnities of pre 1898 members seven per cent. The court passed a resolution, after the matter had been generally discussed, opposing the changes.

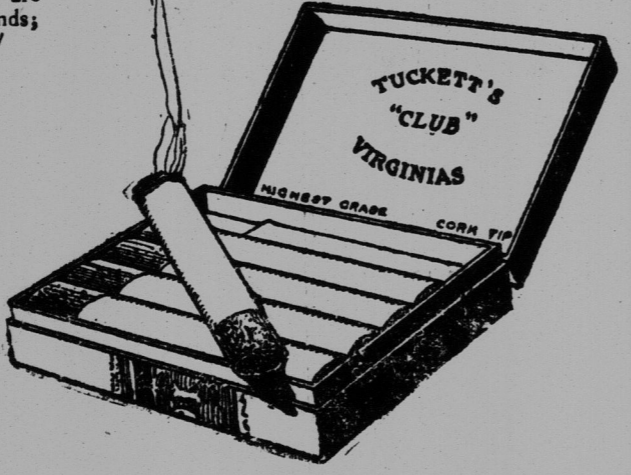
