### REDUCE THE TARIFF

Montreal papers are devoting considerable attention to the high cost of livlng, and comparisons are made between prices in this country and those in the old country. In a comparison it is shown that Canadian prices are much higher. The Montreal Daily Telegraphy makes a comparison between the weekly cost of rent in London, other English cities and in the city of Montreal. Taking, for example, a flat of five rooms, the weekly cost in London is found to be \$2.25 to \$3.20; in other cities in England, \$1.85 to \$1.60; and in Montreal from \$8.00 to \$5.00. 
