

him, shall explain to the Synod the bearing of any portion of the report, if requested by any member of the-Synod.

4. All Reports of Committees recommending any action or expression of opinion, shall be accompanied by a resolution for the action of the Synod thereon.

5. To facilitate the despatch of business, and to insure a more effectual consideration of all matters to be discussed at the meeting of Synod, there shall be an Executive Committee, nominated and presided over by the Bishop, consisting of twelve members, six chosen from among the Clergy, and six from among the Lay Representatives.

6. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to prepare in due form all such matters as the Bishop may desire to have brought before the Synod, and also such other matters as may be forwarded to them, through the Secretaries, by any member of the Synod previous to the first day of May in each year; and a circular containing a statement of such business to be submitted to the Synod shall be forwarded to each Clergyman and Representative two weeks before the meeting of the Synod; which business shall stand first in the order of the day.
