OTTAWA, Feb. 4.—I had an interview with several of the ministers today, regarding Sir John's trade policy, said Hon. Mr. Tupper. The appeal to the people at this time is simply that the government in their endeavor to effect a fair reciprocal arrangement with the States is not to be deterred by the United States Government might have the assurance that any proposals the government might make or the Canadian government accept would be sanctioned by parliament. For instance our government would not enter upon anything to do with unrestricted reciprocity when we would say so the United States government.
