

I---COURSES FOR THE COLLEGE DIPLOMA.

A.—The Four Years' Course.

FIRST YEAR.

I.—ENGLISH.*

FIRST TERM—Essays of Elia :—Lamb.

SECOND TERM—Under the Willows, and The Cathedral :—Lowell.

THIRD TERM—Essay on Bunyan :—Macaulay.

FOURTH TERM—The Task, Bk. V. :—Cowper.

In this year a short Composition with attention to Penmanship will be required of each student every week. Such grammatical exercises, analysis, etc., as may be found necessary to aid in the appreciation and expression of good English will also be required, together with the memorizing of selected portions of the authors studied.
