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COMMISSIONER McLELLAN WILL PROBE THE AFFAIRS OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

Evidence will be Taken Under Oath and Sessions will be Public--Council Grants Authority for Complete Investigation.

"If Stories Are True there are Some Men on the Police force who Should Not be There", Said Commissioner of Public Safety, when Asking Yesterday for Authority to Take Evidence Under Oath.

An investigation into the police department will be conducted by Commissioner McLeellan, who was authorized by the city council yesterday to take evidence under oath.

The council amended the bill board by-law by raising the license fees for posters from 2 cents per lineal foot to 3 cents per square foot.

The commissioner of water and sewerage recommended that the order of common council of the 23rd day of October, 1910, to lay a sewer westward in prolongation of Clarendon street, crossing the property of the St. John Railway Company, and there connecting with the main sewer which drains Main street, be varied in accordance with the plan herewith submitted and lay a water main, making in all, an estimated cost of \$4,000.
