

TURKEY WILL ACT FOR HERSELF IN **CAUCASUS REGION** LADDERS

nstantinople Newspaper Ex plains Situation From Otto man Viewpoint—Ambassi dor To Berlin Dead.

Amsterdam, July 30—Turkey is go-ing to handle the situation in the Cau-casus according to her own ideas. This is indicated in a telegram from Con-stantinople dated July 28, which quotes an article in the newspaper Nashri Ekflar presenting the Turkish view-noshs.

"We have nothing to say against the principles laid down in the Brest-Litovsk treaty," says the newspaper, "but when the Caucasus, newly re-organised, turned toward us, and, master of its own destinies, refused to be bound by the treaty, what was more natural for us than to take into consideration the necessities of the new situation created by our own eastern front?
Could we close our ears to the appeal of the government of a people largely of the same race and same creed as ourselves?
