TO ASSIST ARID DISTRICTS Lieutenant-Governor in Council Elaborates a Scheme to Help the Farmers get Water by Boring

The executive council has under consideration a report from the Commissioner of Public Works, dated July 3, stating that in many parts of the province serious inconvenience and hardship exists resulting from the inability of settlers to secure a water supply and that in many instances these conditions are due to the absence of well machinery.

The minister also reports that in order to assist in the solution of this difficulty it is desirable to encourage the importation of well machines adapted to the requirements of particular districts.

Nothing in the foregoing is to be construed as prejudicially affecting arrangements made in respect to assistance to importers of well machines prior to this order in council and payments may be made in such cases in accordance with the arrangements already agreed upon.
