Was first Deputy Reeve of the Tp. of Vaughan from 1874 to 1879, and was Warden of the County of York in 1878. Was for many years Co. Master of the Orangemen of West York, and was Grand Treasurer of the Orange Grand Lodge of Ontario West, from 1877 to 1883, when he resigned. Has been Grand Master of the Orangemen of British America since 1887. Takes an active interest in agricultural societies. Is Presdt. of the York Farmers' Colonization Co., the operations of which are in the North-West. Was Chairman of the Committee of Parlt. apptd. to investigate the operations of the combines formed to restrain trade, and he introduced and carried a measure declaring such combinations to be illegal. Apptd. Controller of Customs, 6 Dec., 1892,—resigned 1895. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1878, and re-elected at g. e., 1882, 1887 and 1891. A Liberal-Conservative.—*Woodbridge, Ont.*

WILSON, URIAH (*Lennox*).

Father a native of England, and mother from the County Tyrone, Irel. B. 17 March, 1841, in Township of North Fredericksburg, Co. of Lennox and Addington, Ont. Educated at the Public School, Napanee, Ont. M., 1867, Mary Moyle, Napanee. Is a merchant. Represented Centre Ward in Town Council 1875, 1876, and 1878. Deputy Reeve of Napanee, 1879, 1880, 1881 and 1882. Warden of County of Lennox and Addington in 1882. Reeve of Napanee in 1884 and 1885, and Mayor in 1886. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1887; defeated at g. e., 1891, but returned at by-election in 1892, and again at g. e., 1896. A Conservative.—*Napanee, Ont.*

WOOD, ANDREW TREW (*Hamilton*).

Family on paternal side came from Scotland, and on maternal side from England, and settled in North of Irel. Eldest s. of David Wood, Esq., a merchant in Mount Norris, Armagh, Irel.
