On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny, it was

Ordered, That the same be postponed until to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the House was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting the admeasurement "and registration of Vessels."

After some time, the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Botsford from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with an amendment, which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive it.

Urdered, That the Report be now received, and the said amendment being twice read, and the question of concurrence put thereon, it was agreed to.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny. it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time to-morrow.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by the Honorable Sir George E. Cartier, Baronet, and others, in the following words :

HOUSE OF COMMONS,

Tuesday, 1st June, 1869.

Resolved, That a Message be sent to the Senate to acquaint that House that this House hath agreed to their Address to His Excellency; praying him to transmit the Joint Address of both Houses to Her Majesty, praying that she will be graciously pleased by and with the advice of Her Most Honorable Privy Council, under the 146th clause of "The Britsh North America Act of 1867," and the provisions of the Imperial Act 31 and 32 Vict, Cap. 105 to unite Rupert's Land on the terms and conditions expressed in the Resolutions on which the said Address is founded; and also to unite North Western Territory with the Dominion of Canada, as prayed for, by and on the terms and conditions contained in the Joint Address of the Senate and Commons of Canada, adopted during the First Session of the First Parliament of Canada, and hereinbefore referred to, in such way as to His Excellency may seem fit, in order that the same may be laid at the foot of the Throne, by filling up the blank with the word "Commons."

Ordered, That the Honorable Sir George E. Cartier do carry the said Message to the Senate.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Mitchell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Campbell, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Banking, Commerce and Railways.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the House was adjourned during pleasure, and again put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting Offences "against the Porson."
