

WHEN TO AND WHERE TO


You can tell where the ball is going by your opponent's follow-through. As soon as you know where the ball is going, you should take your racquet back.

Never take the racquet back just as the ball is landing. You will have no time to adjust for the bounce or speed of the ball. Waiting too long to take your racquet back causes you to rush your strokes


