Forty years ago, all Canadian citizens, age 16 and over, were required to register. 'Because of the magnitude of this task the Government stresses that every question must be answered truthfully and without evasion. You will make the whole task easier for yourself and the Government by registering early' . . . 'My Little Chickadee', starring Mae West and W.C. Fields, was shown at the Vogue Theatre . . . Faced with an acute shortage of farm labor, the Ontario government was enlisting the co-operation of local school boards in keeping primary schools closed until Sept. 16 and secondary schools until Oct. 2nd as the province's young people were encouraged to enrol in the 'Soldiers of the Soil' program; 'This war is not going to be over in a day. We must look to the future and prepare ourselves for what is likely to develop in the immediate years to come' . . . The Port Credit Weekly offered a one year's subscription to the paper, and a choice of three other magazines, such as Maclean's, Chatelaine, McCall's, Newsweek, and Ladies Home Companion, for \$3.10 . . . The paper also ran an announcement that 'We now have in stock Memorial Cards with envelopes to match. In time of bereavement we will be able to supply your needs' . . . In response to a New York Times editorial stating that Canada needs tourists, The Weekly stressed that 'An American who cannot meet these simple requirements (of the Canadian customs) probably ought not to travel anyhow' and the American tourist 'who happens not to like Adolf Hitler' can feel pleased to know that the dollars that he spends in Canada will go back to the United States to buy airplanes and other facilities that may put Hitler out of business.'

Council crushes Meadowvale plan

Mississauga councillors have turned down recommendations of the Meadowvale West Homeowners Association regarding traffic problems.

In a letter sent last February to Mississauga Mayor Hazel McCallion, residents outlined their concerns about the impact of the expansion and reconstruction of major roads in their neighborhood, of the proposed GO-train station and of new development. They asked the city to consider lowering speed

limits on major routes, restricting truck traffic on Erin Mills Parkway to daytime hours only, that houses next to major roads be better soundproofed and potential home buyers be forewarned of road reconstructions; that traffic be prohibited at night along major roads, like Winston Churchill Boulevard; that earth berms be located on public property only; that the GO station platform be built on both sides of the tracks; and that bicycle paths be constructed along the top or the sides of all berms on all major roads in West Meadowvale West.

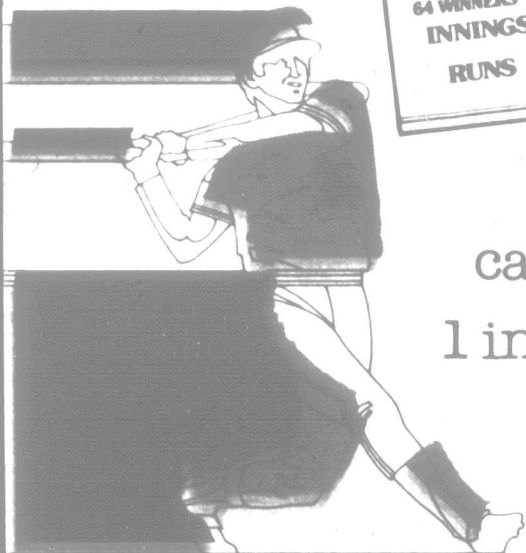

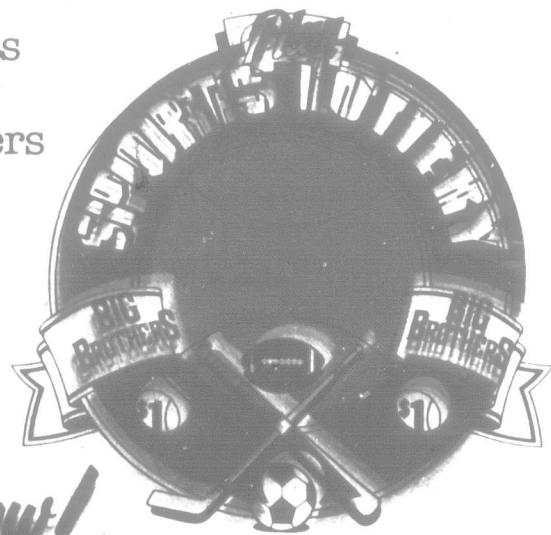
