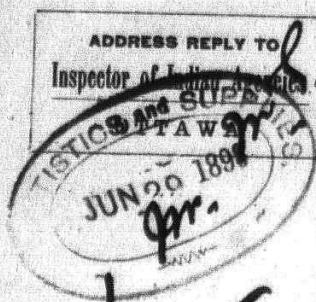

Submit for the information of the
Department the following information
re St. Maurice Band, P. Q.

At Kikendatch where most of the band
centre they have no cultivation and only
one house, built for their visiting priest;

At Neymontichingie are five small
houses but no cultivation whatever;

At Cocoseache are two houses
and small potato patches.

The Reserve at Neymontichingie
is, I was informed, very poor land
with some few good patches. The
general character of the soil is stony
and sandy.

The Reserve at Cocoseache, on
the other hand is said to contain
a good proportion of arable
land.

Neither, according to my information,
have valuable timber upon them.
