 Judgment which was thereupon pronounced, from
 which Your Excellency will perceive that the
 several pretensions of the Jesuits, and of the
 Indians, to the Land now in Question, have
 been legally discussed and finally settled by
 a Court of competent Jurisdiction, by whose
 Judgment the claim of the Indians has
 been rejected, and the Title of the Jesuits in
 whose right the Signement of Labrairie by
 La Magdelaine is now held, thereby confirmed.
