BY THE COMMISSIONER: These lists are just being presented by Mr paquette in order to show the method of negotiating?

WITNESS: That is it exactly.

You also asked me in regard to the records of the Council. By the records of the Council, dated April 25th 1908, you will see that the question of the reduction of wages posted in all the departments of the Dominion textile Company was discussed. It was proposed by Brother N Therrien, Seconded by that brother Ouelette -- ~~with~~ a committee composed of Mr Gignac and Mr parent should have an interview with the general manager of the company, Mr A G Mole to know if the company was serious in this reduction of wages, and if so, that the mule spinners should be authorized to go on strike Monday morning, the 4th day of May, that they should not go back to their work without the understanding that the said reduction would not be enforced in any department of the Dominion Textile Company.

It was also decided unanimously by the Council that the Council would take all means at its disposal to protect the mule spinners in case of a strike.

This is signed by Mr Gignac as general president of the organization, and it is also signed by me as secretary.
