Sir,-

The lands comprising Indian Reserves fronting on navigable waters are limited by ordinary highwater mark. In reply to requests from this Department
the different Departments having any jurisdiction over
fore-shores and all the Provinces promised that no
fore-shore rights in front of Indian Reserves would
be granted without previously communicating with this
Department.

I have the honour to ask you to be good enough to, advise whether the Indian interest in the said fore-shores and riparian rights as riparian owners may be dealt with by this, without previous surrender of the same by the Indians.
