

## First Witness for Prosecution

235091 Sgt Carlomhe H. P. Bty 2 C. S. R. sworn states.

On the 14 Feb 45 I was acting in the capacity of B.S.M.  
 At 2230 hrs I checked the tattoo roll call, I asked  
 Cdr Kostyk if the signallers were all accounted for  
 and I was informed ~~that~~ there was one man missing,  
 from information I received I was of the opinion  
 that Gnr Sullivan one of the accused whom  
 I recognize was absent, I then checked the  
 remainder ~~of~~ the quarters and found Gnr Laplace,  
 one of the accused whom I recognize, <sup>to be</sup> absent.  
 Gnr Laplace reported in to the ord room at app  
 2400 hrs 14 Feb 45 and Gnr Sullivan reported  
 to me at app the same time in my billets. At app  
 1900 hrs on 14 Feb 45 I left my billets to go for  
 a walk; my billets were at 120 Van Sant street  
 Nijmegen Holland; and I returned at app 2100  
 hrs and I was informed by the civilians in  
 the house, Mr Banderij, that a soldier had  
 been in the house looking for me at 2000 hrs,  
 and at 2030 hrs, accompanied by another soldier;

Prosecutor produces a piece of paper to the court.

I recognize the piece of paper marked B.A. as  
 a piece of paper handed to me by one of the  
 Banderij's, at 2100 hrs 14 Feb.

I then went to my room and noticed that one  
 crate of rum was missing, I had been there  
 when I left the room at 1900 hrs that day.
