BRITAIN AND FRANCE.

The General Treaty of Arbitration Concluded.

Paris, Oct. 9.-It was learned in authoritative quarters last evening that the terms of the general treaty of arhitration between France and Great Britain have been concluded between Foreign Minister Delcasse and the authorities in London. All the substantial features of the treaty have now been settled. There only remain minor questions of detail before the signing of the treaty. These formalities are so far advanced that the treaty is considered to be an accomplished fact today. The treaty is mainly significant in being the culmination of the rapprochement between France and Great Britain after centuries of warfare, the maintenance of defensive armaments, the recent animosities growing out of the Fashoda incident and the South African war. It is also significant of the tendency towards a rearrangement of the European political alliances.

The treaty is mainly the outcome of the exchange of visits between King Edward and President Loubet, and the visit of Baron d'Estournelles de Constant and the French Parliamentarians to London. Foreign Minister Delcasse and the au-

M'DOUGALL A SICK MAN.

Doctors Declare That He Cannot Recover-The Trial Postponed. Toronto, Oct. 9. - The physical condition of Alfred McDougall, the accused Government official, is rapidly growing more ser-ious, and it is doubtful if he will eyer be able to stand his trial. The case

be able to stand his trial. The case was called before Judge Winchester yesterday in the General Sessions, but a further adjournment untl November 25th was made.

Dr. Arthur Jukes Johnsonu testified that he and Dr. Cotton examined the accused on Wednesday. Mr. McDougall was in a very weak condition, suffering from arterial neurosis, recovery from which is impossible. He is subject to sudden rushes of blood to the heart, which causes fainting spells. If the patient is kept quiet he may live some little time longer, but, judging from his present condition, there is no hope of his recovery, and his life depends upon his being kept quiet.
