

Always be firm with her, however, and gradually she will come all right. Drive her in an open bridle.

Breeding Old Mare.


1. Should an old mare be bred to a young horse? Mare is over 15, and in good condition.

Ans.—A mare which goes to this age without raising a foal may not get with foal no matter what horse she is beed to. We would advise breeding to a young, vigorous, sure horse, but not to a four- or five-year-old horse, or one even older than this, if a good one is
