Mr. Craswell, by leave, presented the following Petitions, and the same were severally received and read, viz:—

A Petition of the late Office-bearers of the Prince County Central Agricultural Society, praying that this House will concur with the House of Assembly, in granting aid towards the funds of that Institution.

Ordered, That the said Petition be referred to the Special Committee, appointed to examine and report on all Petitions relating to Agriculture.

A Petition of divers Inhabitants of Township No. 19, praying aid to improve a Road in that District.

Ordered, That the said Petition be referred to the Special Committee, appointed to examine and report on all Petitions relating to Roads, Bridges and Wharfs.

A Petition of Lauchlan Macinnis, of Township No. 19, setting forth the helpless condition of his two crippled children, and praying relief.

Ordered, That the said Petition be referred to the Special Committee, appointed to examine and report on all Petitions relating to Paupers.

Mr. Bagnall, by leave, presented the following Petitions, and the same were severally received and read, viz:—

A Petition of William Mugford, of Township No. 21, a cripple, in indigent circumstances, and praying relief.

Ordered, That the said Petition be referred to the Special Committee, appointed to examine and report on all Petitions relating to Paupers.

A Petition of William Cousins, Duncan M'Intyre and Robert Simpson, Commissioners for the recovery of Small Debts, at New London, setting forth, the great inconvenience they labour under for want of a Building wherein to hold their Court, and praying the favourable consideration of this House.

A Petition of John Macleod, of New London, setting forth, that in a suit brought by him against Thomas Pickering, for the recovery of a debt, due for work performed on the public Roads, he had obtained a Judgment in the Small Debt Court, against which decision the said Thomas Pickering had entered an Appeal in the Supreme Court; that in consequence of a violent snow storm, which entirely impeded the travelling, and prevented the Petitioner's timely appearance at Court, he found, on his arrival, that the Supreme Court had previously dismissed the said Appeal, along with others, for want of prosecution, whereby the Petitioner has lost his just Debt, and is called upon to pay an amount of costs, which he has no means of defraying, and praying relief.

Ordered, That the two last preceding Petitions be referred to the Special Committee appointed to examine and report on all Petitions on Miscellaneous subjects.
