GOVERNMENT BOUNTIES.


Ending With March 31.

Ottawa, June 11.—The total amount paid by the Dominion Government in bounties for the fiscal period of the nine months ending March 31, was \$1,299,801. For the 12 months of the previous fiscal period the total amount paid in bounties was \$2,004,339.

The amounts paid during the past nine months were as follows: Pig iron, \$365,231; puddled iron bars, \$311; steel ingots, \$575,259 manufactures of steel, \$333,998.

The following places in Ontario have been established as outports of customs and warehousing ports: Belle River, Cobalt, Hawkesbury and Park Hill. The customs collecting station at Grafton, Ont. has been closed.
