"ICE-SNOW-AQUAPLANE" AERIAL LIMOUSINE TO FLY TO

NORTH POLE SOON Two views-interior and exterior-of one of the three all-metal Dornier monoplanes which are being completed now for the flight to the North Pole, which will be attempted next summer by Captain Roald Amundsen—the famous discoverer of the South Pole and the first man to negotiate the almost fabulous Northwest Passage-aided by Haakon H. Hammer, of Seattle. Note the unique bottom on the outside of the plane, designed to permit take-off or landing on either ice, snow or water, and the complete appointments of the interior, as snug, comfortable and complete as a small yacht's cabin. The engines are especially designed to withstand the lowest temperatures. With these planes the expedition will hop off from Northern Spitzenbergen, bisect the Arctic Circle, cross the North Pole, and land at Point Barrow. Is there a sixth continent in the Great North? Valuable aerial photographs taken on the expedition are expected to prove the answer to this ancient question,
