County of Carleton Tuesday, The 12th Day of October

NEXT

Fifteen days public notice of the time and place of holding election to be given by Parish Clerks by posting in three most public places of the Parish. Nomination of Candidates to be filed with the Parish Clerk or to be left at his residence at or before six o'clock p. m. on Monday, the 4th day of October next.

Parish Clerks to post names of Candidates in three of the most public places in each Polling District on or before Thursday, the 7th day of October next.

Candidates' names also to be posted up at the Polling Places before opening of poll on day of election.

The Parish Clerk or District Clerk (as the case may be) to act as Chairman, unless he refuses to serve, or is absent, or is not competent by reason of relationship of Candidate, when chairman to be chosen by electors present.

Assessors are required to furnish Parish Clerks with a list of electors.
