To the Harbour Master, Pilots,

Owners, Masters and persons in

charge of vessels on the Miramichi

River, N. B., and all others whom it

may concern:

THE Department of Public Works of Can-

ada, being about to resume operations

for the improvement of the Channel at the

Miramichi River, will from this date have the

Dredge "St. Lawrence"

engaged in performing the dredging required

and the said dredge will have a number of

anchors, lines, and cables for mooring pur-

poses deposited in the Channel and on the

banks on either side of the Channel, all of

which when put down will be buoyed.

All masters of Steamers are cautioned to

keep clear of said buoys, lines and cables, so

as to prevent their being taken up and fouled

in the paddles or propellers—as the above

mentioned moorings will be in place when

the dredge is there or not.

As whilst working it is not possible to shift

or remove the dredge, vessels will be required

to give it a wide berth so as to avoid col-

lision and damage.
