EASTERN S. S. SUMMER PLANS ARE COMPLETE

Sunday Boat From Boston a Feature—Three Direct Trips a Week Between St. John and the Hub.

The Eastern Steamship Company have completed arrangements for the summer season of 1910 and they announce their list of sailings. It provides in addition to coastwise trips, for three direct trips each week from Boston for St. John direct.

The steamers which will perform the service are the turbine steel steamship Governor Cobb, and the steel steamships Calvin Austin and Governor Dingley. These vessels are equipped with wireless telegraph, main deck observation dining rooms, comfortable staterooms and every convenience for an enjoyable sea voyage.

The summer arrangement will go into effect in June, the first sailing from Boston being on June 20 and the first from St. John on June 21 and continuing until Oct. 1. The order of sailings will be as follows:—

AYLESWORTH'S REMOVAL ASKED

Brotherhood of Ralph Connor's Church Protests Against Release of Traffickers in Obscene Pictures

Winnipeg, April 25—The brotherhood of St. Stephen's church, of which Rev. C. W. Gordon (Ralph Connor) is pastor, decided at a meeting yesterday afternoon to wire to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, protesting against the release from Ontario Central prison of King and Skitt, who were charged with trafficking in obscene pictures and immoral books. The brotherhood also voted in favor of asking Sir Wilfrid to remove Hon. A. B. Aylesworth from office. The matter was referred to by Dr. Gordon in his morning sermon, when he severely condemned the action of Mr. Aylesworth, and in the afternoon it was again brought up by Dr. Gordon, when it was decided to wire the premier.

ONTARIO MURDER TRIAL MAY PROVIDE BIG SENSATION

Fenton Mystery at Hamilton is Engaging Attention of Many Experts

BLOODY PRINTS OF MAN'S FINGERS

They Were Found on the Barn Door And Are Taken to be Very Important

Hamilton, Ont., April 28—Interesting developments are promised tomorrow night when the coroner's jury begins probing the Elijah Fenton mystery. The police promise to spring a sensation. It is possible that the finger print expert in charge of the Dominion Bureau at Ottawa will be called upon to examine the bloody finger prints on the barn door. The jurors attach the greatest importance to these. It was these marks more than anything else that convinced them that murder had been committed. Dr. Green's explanation that possibly he made them after handling the body, although he would not be sure, leaves the question of how the marks came there open. If Dr. Green did not cause them old Fenton's slayer must have. Dr. Edgar, who had charge of the autopsy, is a medical expert who has figured in several notable cases, including the Barton murder mystery, the trial of Mrs. Mattie Perkins at Cayuga, and the Kinrade case.
