### THE BIGGEST ELEVATORS IN THE WORLD

It is really astonishing to read about the way the wheat crop of Western Canada is poured each fall through the elevators of the Twin Cities on Lake Superior—Port William and Port Arthur. Last year 45,000,000 bushels out of a crop of 125,000,000 bushels, went through the big terminal elevators in eighty days. The real significance of this is made clear by T. M. Ralston in the course of a remarkable article in October Busy Man's entitled "Pouring Grain through the Big Funnel." He points out that during the past year eighty-nine million bushels were handled by the Twin City elevators, that it required eighty-nine thousand cars to hold this quantity and that this involved the despatching from Winnipeg of thirteen thousand trains of seventy cars each. The method of handling the grain is a most interesting fashion and a description of the mammoth elevators—the largest in the world—is given.
