**Mary Pickford
Granted A Divorce
From Owen Moore**

Reno, Nev. March 3—Mary Pickford, who was granted a divorce on Monday from her husband, Owen Moore told the court that Moore had deserted her on several occasions and had only returned in response to her pleas, but that a year ago he left her and has ever since refused to return.

Immediately after obtaining the decree she went back to the Campbell Ranch near where she has been living. She said she was seeking a quiet place to live and intended to stay near Minden for a long time and to make the state her permanent home.

Moore arrived at Virginia City on Sunday night with a camera man, saying he intended to take snow pictures for a coming picture but he could find no hotel accommodations and he drove down to Minden in a machine and was served with the papers while at lunch there next day. The ranch where Miss Pickford is staying is on the outskirts of the deserted town of Genoa, first settled by the Mormons in 1847 but now with scarcely an inhabitant.



**U. S. Producers
Alarmed At Los-
ing Good Business**

Toronto, March 3—The Canadian Reconstruction Association, in a statement issued tonight, says:

"Alarmed at the prospect of losing many profitable Canadian accounts an increasing number of United States producers and merchants are offering to accept payment in Canadian currency. Canadian buyers should clearly understand that all purchases of imported goods, even if Canadian money is accepted at par, help to pile up a balance of trade against this country and to increase the discount on our money. In reality, the offer of the foreign sellers means either that they are quoting higher prices to Canadian purchasers to cover the loss on exchange, or they are practicing a form of dumping, by selling to Canada currency at the same nominal price as they charge United States customers who pay in United States funds. Canadian buyers who may be tempted to take advantage of such offers, instead of purchasing in Canada should be mindful that they are either paying the exorbitant quotations, or else they are partners in the dumping of United States goods into this market at prices below the selling prices in the United States.

**Suit Sale Blocks
Traffic In London**

London, Feb. 27—One hundred thousand tailor made suits, offered to the public at \$14 apiece, blocked the traffic along the Strand, one of London's busiest thoroughfares, throughout today, in the midst of an almost continuous rainstorm.

The sale was the beginning of a tremendous onslaught on clothing profiteers by Harry Mallaby Deeley, millionaire member of Parliament, which is thrilling all England. From an early hour in the morning, long before the sale opened, thousands of well-dressed men and women, boys and girls, stormed the doors of the public benefactor's "place of business." So great was the congestion that the police reserves had to be called to clear the street. But the crowd, once came back. Thousands were held up for hours at a time, causing great business losses, but the crowd laughed, and did not care as long as it got the highest grade of clothing for one-fifth of the original price, the general cost of a tailored suit in Britain being \$75.

Explaining his purpose to the correspondent, Mr. Mallaby Deeley said:

"I am simply trying to help protect the public against the profiteer, the greatest factor in the present unrest which is at the point of shaking the constitution. I am fighting the prohibitive prices of absolute necessities which are utterly unjustified.

"We are offering the highest grade of clothing the output of four factories—70,000 suits a week, one garment to each customer, and with no profit whatever to ourselves.

"It is a simple lesson in mass production enabling the public to have the first benefit instead of letting combines reap illegal profiteering harvests. Our prices are the lowest in the world. I am not acting as a manufacturer, merchant, or tailor, but as one who wants to give the people what they are entitled to."

**Crown Land
Investigation
At Bathurst**

A number of officials of the Department of Lands and Mines have returned from Bathurst where they were in connection with an investigation of charges preferred against Edward Baldwin forest ranger for the Department, by his helper, Alboin Dolron, who was discharged by Baldwin.

In County Court House

The investigation took place in the Gloucester County Court House in Bathurst, before Hon. E. A. Smith, Minister of Lands and Mines. Deputy Minister T. G. Loggie questioned the witnesses who were present Chief Forester G. H. Prince, Chief Steward A. T. Murchie and Chief Game Warden L. A. Gagnon.

The Charges

The charges preferred against Baldwin by Dolron were as follows:
1. That Baldwin received a present of a live pig which was kept at one of the camps of the Bathurst Lumber Company.

2. That Baldwin falsified the diary which was returned to the Department.

3. That Baldwin underscaled on the operations of the Bathurst Lumber Company.

The investigation was held under the provisions of Chapter 12 Consolidated Statutes, Hon. Mr. Smith will give his decision within a short time.

Sc., will be given excellent instruction in Theory of Foods and Practice in the Making of Soups, cooking of Fish, Meats, Vegetables, making of Salads, Desserts, and Cakes; preparation and serving of meals, Breakfast Luncheon or Supper and Dinner.

Miss Anne Love will efficiently conduct the Millinery classes through the intricate processes of making and trimming hats.

Of special interest will be the lectures and demonstrations in Nursing given by Miss Alice Landry, R. N. Miss Landry has for the past year been with the (Victorian) Order of Nurses, Halifax and comes to us highly recommended for her work.

Following Sussex, classes will be held in Moncton, Devon, Perth, Chatham, Bathurst and St. Stephen.
