Cana-Han buyers dian currency. Canadian buyers should clearly understand that all parchases of imported goods, even Canadian money is accepted at par help to pile up a balance of trade against this country and to increase the discount on our money. In real ity, the offer of the foreign sellers means either that they are quoting higher iprices to Canadian purchas ers to cover the loss on exchange, or they are practicing a form of dump ing, by selling to Canada currency at the same nominal price as they charge United States customers who pay in United States funds. Canad ian buyers who may be tempted to take advantage of such offers, in stead of purchasing in Canada should be mindful that they are eith er paying the exhigher quotations, or else they are partners in the dum ping of United States goods into this market at prices below the selling prices in the United States.
