

THE COST OF CONVEYANCING IN ENGLAND.—It is not much matter for surprise in England should be clamoring for a reform in the cost of conveying land. The expensive character of a business transaction that we should consider a very simple affair, is in England most burdensome, as may be seen from the following illustrative case, which lately occurred. A plot of land was given for the erection of a school room. Its value was estimated at £15; the cost of conveyance amounted to nearly £25, as follows: Surveyors' fee, £2 2s; solicitor's fee for obtaining signature of patrons, £5; stamps and parchment, 15s; parchment for copy fee; fee for bishop's signature, £2 2s; fees and stamps on indenture, £3 5s 6d; agents' charges, £2 12s; postage and parcels, 5s; solicitor's fees, 28s. Total £24 15s 6d. In other words it cost £125 to transfer a piece of property worth £75. The English law evidently does not anticipate the possibility of land changing ownership very often.
