Washington, Aug. 29.—The treaty beween Japan and Korea, by which the Hermit Kingdom is annexed as a sovereign part of Japan, has been made public to the state department. In addition to the text of the convention ,a declaration of the Japanese Government concerning the effect of the annexation upon powers enjoying treaties with Japan is made public.

Existing Korean schedules, covering imports from foreign countries and regulations governing coasting trade, will be continued for ten years. The copyright and patent laws of Japan will e extended to Korea.
