Former London Lady Died in Port Arthur, Ont.

THE ETHICS OF ART

Address by Mrs. T. C. Duncan in Collegiate Institute on Saturday.

"Art and the Ethics of Art" was the title of an interesting lecture given by Mrs. T. C. Duncan in the Collegiate Institute on Saturday afternoon under the auspices of the London Art Association. She showed how art received a new and religious impulse in the birth of Christ and the rise of Christianity. Architecture more especially experienced a great stimulus from Christianity.

Prof. Matthews has said that art is simply doing well what one has to do. "If art is doing and science is knowing, then we are all artists and scientists," said Mrs. Duncan.

French writer has said that art is to man what creation is to God.

"Art has its origin in the heart and soul of humanity."

"The woman who is a good homemaker is a realist, less than the painter of a beautiful picture."

"The appreciation of the beauty of landscapes and nature is fully developed in some, in others it is not. Art clubs do much to awaken an interest in the beauty and wonder of nature in the minds of children. All worthy art is colored by personality. Without the personal element all art is worthless. Personality cannot be forced in art. It comes from within."

"The artists must keep in mind the perfect pattern. To bring art into our lives and make them really beautiful we must keep closely before us the perfect pattern of Christ," said Mrs. Duncan. In the discussion which followed Mrs. Duncan's address, Miss Blackburn cited examples of personality in art. She contrasted the work of Raphael, which is lacking in human affinity, with the work of Botticelli, into which the element of personality is brought.

But both Raphael and Botticelli failed to realize and embody in their art the truth which is reserved for this epoch, that the divine and the human are one and the same.

ARTHUR STRINGER'S POEMS WIN HIGH PRAISE

Richard Le Gallienne Couples His Name With That of Yeats.

Richard Le Gallienne, the English poet and critic, in a published study of recent poetry couples the names of Arthur Stringer and William Butler Yeats, the Irish poet, and not altogether to the disadvantage of the younger Canadian poet.

"For some time," writes Mr. Le Gallienne, "I have been thinking of the old magic from his work, and he would seem to have foreseen singing entirely in favor of a cryptic utterance of dark saying that are entirely without beauty, and when drop-his, seem to convey matter of great importance. Often in the past, owing to his employment of imagery drawn from unfamiliar Irish folk-lore, or his recitative studies in music, the meaning of his verse was far from clear, but that mattered little, so long as there was the meaning of beauty, the meaning of mystery. Now, however, he gives us nothing but the dry stalks of poems."

"Mr. Yeats would no doubt look disdainfully upon Mr. Arthur Stringer's Irish poems, with their simple emotions, and facile fitting music, and I confess, having no particular predilection for Irish dialect. In fact, dialect of any kind seems generally speaking, a bore. But Mr. Stringer handles it so brilliantly, and there is such a dash and swing and so much real stuff of human nature in his verses, that it is impossible not to be led captive."

WAR AND THE GOSPEL

Sir George Pointed Out That It Was a Great Barrier—Church Notes.

Sir George C. Gibbons addressed the Men's League of Askin Street Methodist Church on the democratic spirit of the present age on Sunday morning.

His address was in a large part a strong plea for world peace. "Let us get rid of this idea," he said, "that glory consists in brave men killing other brave men. This is an unhappy survival of our savage ancestry. It has been too long tolerated already, and it will cease only when the common people rise up and declare it at an end. This is a great work that is before us, and men's organizations everywhere can take a significant share in bringing about its accomplishment."
