A band of Rebels and Infantry Also Under Orders—Retreat of the Rebels—Retreat of the Police to Fort Carleton.

The half-breed rebellion in the Northwest has assumed alarming proportions. Aghast at the news of the capture of the Queen's Own and Grenadiers and the rebels under Riel in which ten volunteers and two constables were killed and eleven others wounded.

Before midnight the commanding officers of the Queen's Own and the Royal Grenadiers had received their instructions. Col. Otter was ordered to march to the scene of the rebellion.

At Ottawa, March 27. After recess in the commons, Sir John Macdonald rose and stated that he had received messages from Col. Irvine to the effect that he had arrived at Carleton.
