

BUILDING A NATION.

Documents That Deal With Constitution of Canada.

Because Canada's own scholars ought to be encouraged to work up-on Canada's own subject matters and for the service of Canada's own peo-ple, we welcome the volume of "Documents of the Canadian Consti-tution, 1759-1915" selected and edit-ed by Prof. W. P. M. Kenuedy. The gualifications for selecting and edited by Prot. W. P. M. Kennedy. The qualifications for selecting and edit-ing-for the use of students-agrec-ments, proclamations, treaties, in-structions, ordinances, speeches, de-bates, letters, resolutions, reports and enactments that belong to the history of Canada's constitutional de-velopment in the last 150 years are velopment in the last 150 years are not easily come by, and it is doubtful if there is any better way of acquir-ing them than employment in acadeing them than employment in acade-mic work such as Prof. Kennedy is engaged in in the Department of Modern History at our Provincial University. The sifting of the ma-terial is itself no easy task. The reader who has any knowledge of the mass of the matter that could bc brought together under the title this book bears will be as thankful to Prof. Kennedy for his skill in exclud-ing as for his judiciousness in ading as for his judiciousness in ad-For the versions of many of the state papers his book contains Prof. Kennedy has gone to that abounding source of authoritative texts, the three volumes of "Documents Relat-

ing to the Constitutional History of Canada," published by the Canadian Archives in the seven or eight years preceding the war. In these volumes, in the editing of which Dr. Doughty had a principal part, many docu-ments are included that were never previously published. Of some of them indeed the existence had been generally forgotten. Even that large body of original documents by no means comprehended all in the pos-session of our Archives Branch relat-ing to the constitutional history of Canada. It, too, therefore, was a work of selecting, taking in only the most important and representative of the materials. These Archives vol-umes are now out of print. Moreover, for the use of students a small-er collection would suffice. Prof. Kennedy's book of 707 pages covers

the ground so as to leave nothing to be desired by the general inquirer. As he points out, he has omitted selections from Lord Durham's report for the reason that that landmark in the field of colonial gov-ernment ought to be studied as a whole.
